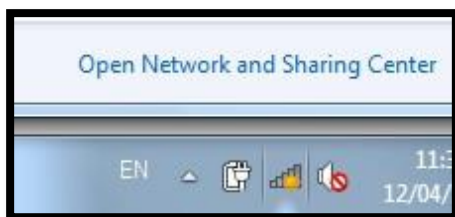

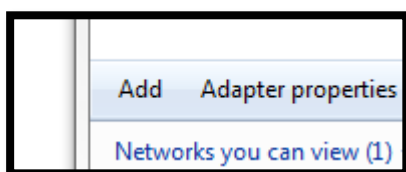
Click on the Wireless icon in the system tray at the bottom right of the screen and then click "**Open Network and Sharing Center**".

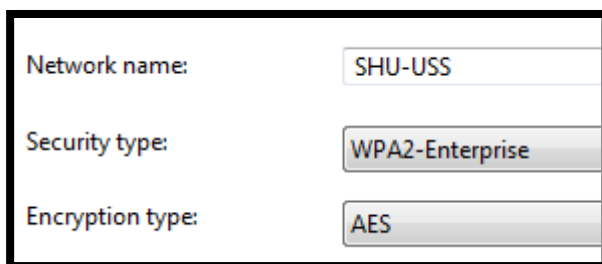
Click "**Add**".

Enter the name, security and encryption settings as shown and then click "**Next**".

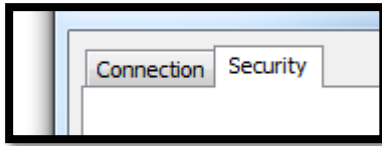

Click "**Change connection settings**".

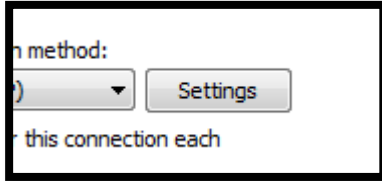

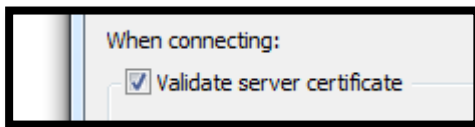
Click the "**Security**" tab.

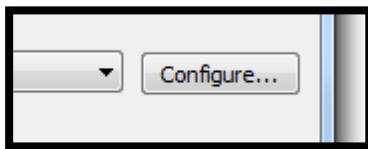
Click the "**Settings**" button.

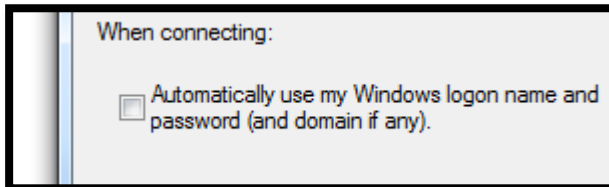
Un-tick "**Validate server certificate**".

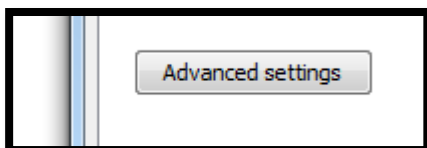
Click the "**Configure**" button.

Un-tick "**Automatically use my Windows logon...**", click **OK**, and then **OK** again to return to the **SHU-USS Wireless Network Properties** Window.

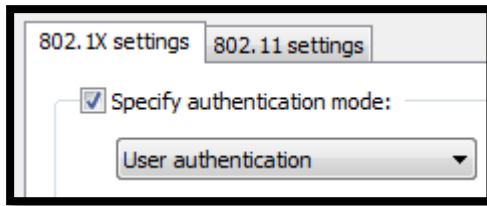

Connecting to SHU Wi-Fi (Windows 7)

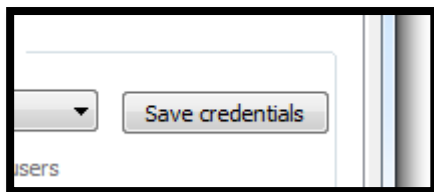

Tick "**Specify authentication mode:**" then choose "**User authentication**".

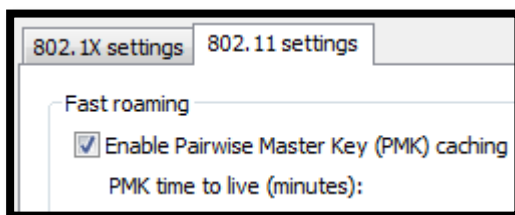
Now click on the "**802.11 settings**" tab
