If you are coming to the UK as a full-time higher education student and you have a European Health Insurance Card (EHIC) which has been issued in an EU country after 1 January 2021, you may be able to apply for a refund of your Immigration Health Surcharge fee.</p> <p>Applicants from some countries are required to have a tuberculosis (TB) test if they are coming to the UK for more than six months.
