

PhD Scholarship Opportunities in Art, Design and Media

Over the last 30 years the [Art, Design and Media Research Centre \(ADMRC\)](#) within the Sheffield Creative Industries Institute (SCII) has nurtured quality research by both staff and doctoral students - by developing and supporting individual researchers, and by fostering collaborative and interdisciplinary projects. Research has focused on addressing challenges across domains - from the reconstruction of post-industrial regions, to voicing the under-represented nationally and internationally, to processes and practices that impact on everyday living.

The standing of researchers within the ADMRC was last peer reviewed in the UK's 2021 Research Excellence Framework (REF) where 90% of our research was rated as either world leading or internationally excellent, placing ADMRC research in the top 10 of UK universities for social, economic, or cultural impact.
