



Riot Cycles



France 3 phases ?

- 1980: unique urban disorders (Lyons)
- 1989-mid 90s: 2d phase
- 2005: violent, nationwide, small cities

- France & UK: 1950s, 1940s, 1930s
- France's banlieues apathy 1980s = the enigma

UK 4 phases?

- 1980s: police-centered conflicts
- 199& & 1992: 'white' post-industrial working class youths
- 2001: inter-racial conflicts and/or anti-BNP battles
- 2011: 1980s duplicated?
- 1?
- France: 1 type of event, UK: 3 types?



Riots Phenomenology (1) Role of looting



France UK No looting Looting

- France: political rebellions,
 'primitive rebels' (Hobsbawn)
 - UK: Mixed events (Keith) + notion of 'opportunity'
 - France: absence of looting as a result of police tactics (encapsulating)
 - France: Where are the stores?

UK: nihilism & consumption

What kind of stores?

France: opportunity structure (Paris protests vs. Banlieue riots)

Germany: urban disorders and 'anticapitalist lootings'

Riots Phenomenology (2) Role of police confrontations



France Determinant

 Systematic, almost 100% immediate cause

UK

Contextual → **Determinant**

- Predominant 1980s
- Not igniting in the 1990s, 2000s
- 2011: Back to the future?

Longstanding right-wing violence, with at least one pogrom-like action (Rostock, 2002)



Riots Morphology (4) Space



France UK Nationwide Local

2005: an *unique* nationwide event

- ...that hides different waves of protest
- ...that show the centrality of the State/Ruler and the immediate link between ruler & rioters
- ...that authorizes large-scale 'US like' correlation studies

2005: parochial factors and diversity within unity

2005: new migrants' cities

Since 2005: poor small-scaled cities (Saint-Dizier, Romans-sur-Isère, Vitry-le-François, Amiens)

Is there any large-scale systematic study?

Diffusion & duplication?

UK

France: collective attempt to re-frame the The 'We'-formation in French Banlieues vs. 1980's riots into a political movement The **Mosque** in 2005 as an key-event (ambiguity)

No **racial conflicts** in France

UK: riots as a piece in a long-term acceptance of race (race relations Act; instit. racism...)

Conclusion: Research is needed!!!


Course of the riots, participants, local leaders, etc.


Second-ranging

UK

- Sarkozy: paradigm of J. Simon's Governing through Crime Disorders
- Winning the election vs. Staying in power (Winning through Dirsorder... Losing through Powerlessness)

 Immediately identifiable electoral profits are scarce

Urban Riots & *Polis* (2) Impact on policies



France

UK

Evanescent → Substantial → Evanescent

Substantial

- 1980s: Urban youths vacation programs → Ministry for Urban **Matters**
- 1990s: Dislocation of the Ministry, 'nothing works' despair
- 2000: Urban renewal (i.e. destructions)
- 2005: Targeted small-scaled policies for minorities
- Constant 'non-policy': Police forces (except 1997-2000)

- 1980s: Scarman Report and the openness of police forces (S&S, IPCC, Minorities, etc.)
- 2000s: Backlash? ('Community Cohesion')
- 2011: ?



Urban Riots & *Polis* (3) Impact on polities



France

Decisive

- Strongly reinforced 'bad reputation effect' of Banlieues
 - ...and that way to the increase of real discrimination & prejudice
- 2005: Contributed to a demand for order and discipline vs. To a (limited) classical politicization in the Banlieues
 - ...and to a slight breach in the 'republican social contract' e.g. minorities
- Long-term: contributed for a neocolonial view on urban youths
 - ...that could not jeopardize long-term decline of overall racism

Decisive

UK

- 1980s: Consolidation of multiculturalism
- 2000s: Community Cohesion and the fear of 'parallel lives'
- 2011: Criminal nihilism & consumerism
 - …overall fear for 'Broken Britain'?
