

Sheffield Hallam Opportunity PhD Scholarships: Graduate Teaching Assistantship (GTA) PhD scholarships for Black, Asian and minority ethnic British students

Sheffield Hallam is committed to addressing barriers to higher education for under-represented groups. To help address the underrepresentation in our postgraduate research student community, we are offering the below scholarships for UK students from ethnically minoritised backgrounds:

Sheffield Hallam Graduate Teaching Assistantship (GTA) PhD scholarships for Black, Asian and minority ethnic British students

Up to three GTA PhD scholarships are available for Home students from a Black, Asian or minority ethnic background.

GTA scholarships are designed to develop the next generation of academics, providing structured opportunities for development and experience in learning, teaching and assessment. As part of their academic development, GTA scholarship holders will receive training in teaching and learning and will undertake up to 180 hours' teaching-related activity per academic year. This activity forms part of the scholarship holder's training and there is no additional payment for it. Eligibility

These scholarships are open to candidates who have UK (Home) fee status and identify as being from a Black, Asian or minority ethnic background. For an explanation of fee status rules see the UK Council for International Students' [HE fee status guide](#)
