If you're using a satnav to find us, the addresses and postcode for City Campus is Howard Street, Sheffield S1 1WB.

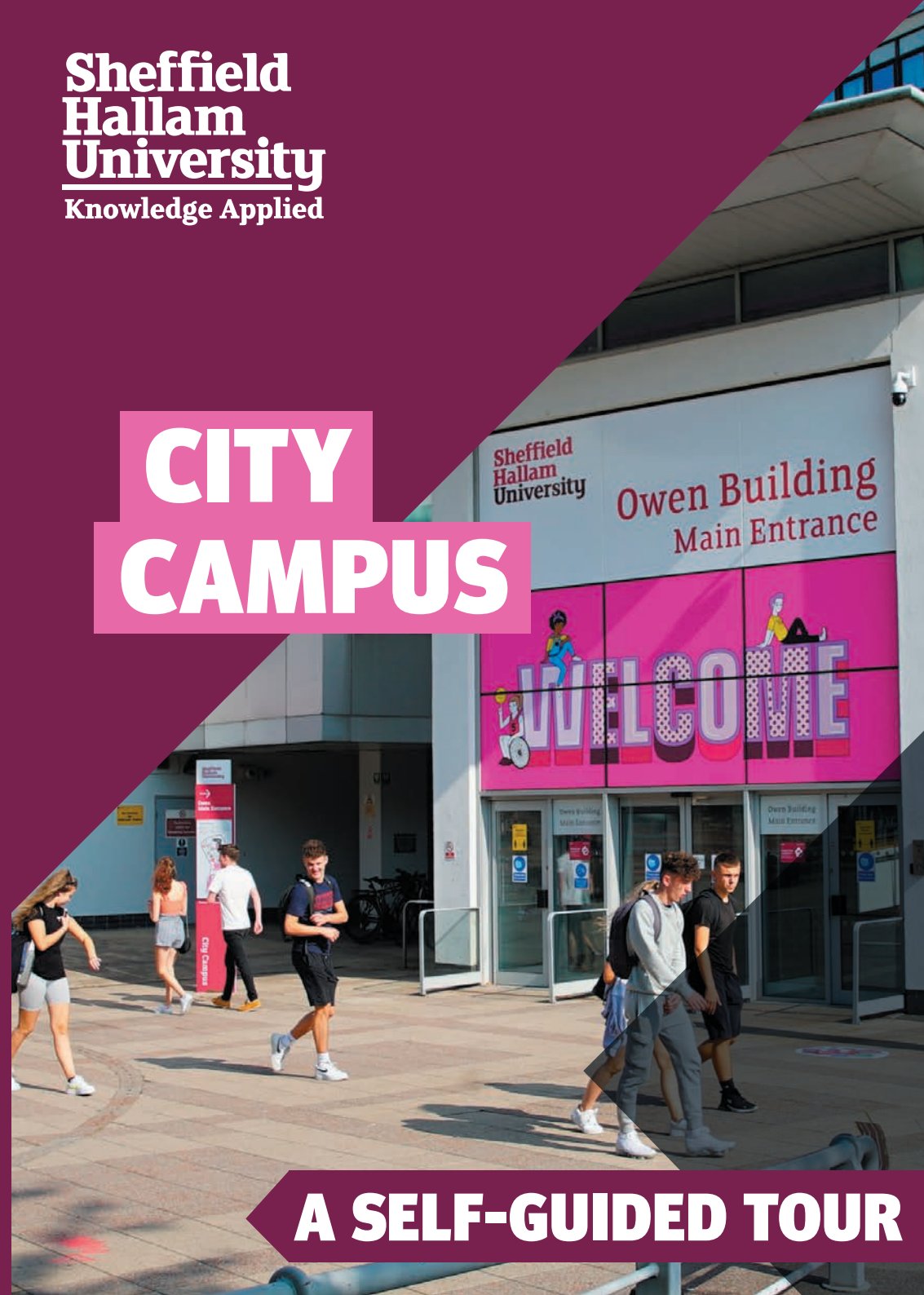

# A WALK AROUND CITY CAMPUS

**Our City Campus is in the heart of Sheffield. This tour will give you a taste of what it has to offer. It takes around 45 minutes to an hour, depending on what you choose to explore.**

## 1 Start your tour in the main entrance.

Have a look around. You'll find the main reception and, further back, Peak lecture theatre. You'll also see the Student Services Centre, which provides advice and support for everything from careers and finances to study skills and your wellbeing. Feel free to enter and pick up leaflets about what they offer. And if you climb the stairs or take the lift to the next floor (level 6) you can look around two of our catering outlets – Chef Hallam Central on your left and Hallam View on your right.



## 2 Leave the building through the main double doors and walk up the steps on your right. (To avoid the steps turn left out of the building and then turn right around the edge of the square.)

As you cross Hallam Square you can see our accommodation office on your left and the Millennium Gallery across the road.

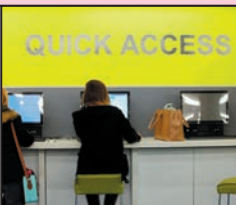


## 3 Take the ramp walkway to the Adsetts Centre on your right.

## 4 Enter the Adsetts Centre and go straight ahead, past two lecture theatres on your left. (If there are no lectures going on feel free to have a look inside.)

## 5 Take the door directly ahead and take the lift or stairs down to level 4. Go outside through the door and enter the Adsetts Centre main entrance on your left.

*Explore* – have a look around the Adsetts Centre. (Be aware that students are working.) Our learning centres offer you an informal, social and creative place to study, with a mix of silent and group work areas. They're open 24 hours a day, 365 days a year – so we're ready to work whenever you are.



## 6 Come back out of the Adsetts Centre the way you came and turn left. Walk along the concourse and through the automatic doors. Take the right-hand set of doors ahead, signposted the Atrium.

The Atrium's 18-month refurbishment was completed in 2021, creating an exciting, vibrant area for students and visitors to enjoy. As you walk through, you'll see the Hallam Cafe and Kitchen above and to your left, on level 5.



## 7 Walk the length of the walkway ahead on your right and then turn left to walk down the stairs to the bottom. (To avoid the steps, take the double doors on your right and take the lift down to level 2. Then come back out of the double doors to find the bottom of the stairs.)

## 8 Opposite the bottom of the stairs are double doors signposted Pennine Lecture Theatre.

*Explore* – go through the doors towards Pennine Lecture Theatre. With 450 seats it's our largest lecture theatre. You'll see pictures on the walls of previous guest speakers. Please be quiet at this point, as there may be a lecture in progress. If there isn't feel free to open the door and have a look.

Once you've looked around, come back through the doors and into the Atrium. Ahead, you'll see social spaces where students and staff can meet and collaborate. This space is also used for a variety of events.

## 9 Exiting the doors for Pennine Lecture Theatre, turn right, passing the Student Finance Centre on your right. Go through two sets of double doors to get outside.

You'll see various teaching buildings including the Eric Mensforth Building on your left, and the Sheaf Building, home to our engineering and design departments, on your right.



## 10 Exit the building through the doors directly ahead. Go down the ramp and onto the main road (Sheaf Street). Turn left and walk a short distance down the road. There will be another left turn. Then walk straight down this road (Harmer Lane). After a minute, you will see Hallam Active Gym directly in front of you.

At Sheffield Hallam Active, you can enjoy a fantastic range of sport, health and fitness services at great prices. There's something to suit all tastes – whether you want to train in the gym, take part in classes, get involved in fun social sport sessions, or complete a coaching and officiating award course.



## 11 Head left up Pond Street, past the Student Health Centre on your right, and follow the road along. Pass the Howard pub on your right and the train station and the Showroom cinema on your left.

## Keep going until you reach our Students' Union. You can't miss it – it's the building designed as four giant stainless steel drums.

*Explore* – to have a look around the Students' Union, enter through the main doors. Among other facilities, you'll find the HubSpace; A place to study, relax and play table tennis. The Common Room can be used for meeting up with friends and Playstation consoles are available. Some societies also meet here. All our students automatically become a member of our Students' Union. You'll have access to all the events, activities and services the Union has to offer. It's run by students for students, and there are

lots of ways you can get involved.

You can choose from over 80 societies, in everything from film to baking. Or start up your own.

You can help shape the direction of the Union, by voting in elections, contacting your Union reps, or even standing to become a rep yourself. You can represent your fellow students on a range of issues, including academic matters, student media and societies.

The Union also has its own free, confidential and independent student advice centre.

## 12 As you leave the Students' Union, turn left and walk back down towards the Howard pub. As you reach it, turn left and walk up the hill.

On your right, on the side of the Owen Building, you'll see a poem written by former poet laureate Andrew Motion.

## 13 Turn right when you get to the Globe pub and you'll find yourself back at the main entrance, where you started your tour.
