## By car

Start your day at City Campus, as parking in the city centre is easier than at Collegiate Campus.

You can park at a discounted rate near City Campus NCP have a few car parks close to our City Campus. At the NCP on Furnival Gate, you can park with a discount voucher which can be collected from level 5 Owen Building.

The APCOA car park on Eyre Street is a five-minute walk from City Campus. You can park there when visiting us. Just scan your blue chip at Owen Level 5, Charles Street and Cantor Helpdesks at City Campus to claim the discount.

If you're a blue badge holder, call us on **0114 225 6464** before your visit and we'll arrange suitable parking. Please note - parking at the discounted car park is not guaranteed and is available on a first come, first served basis.

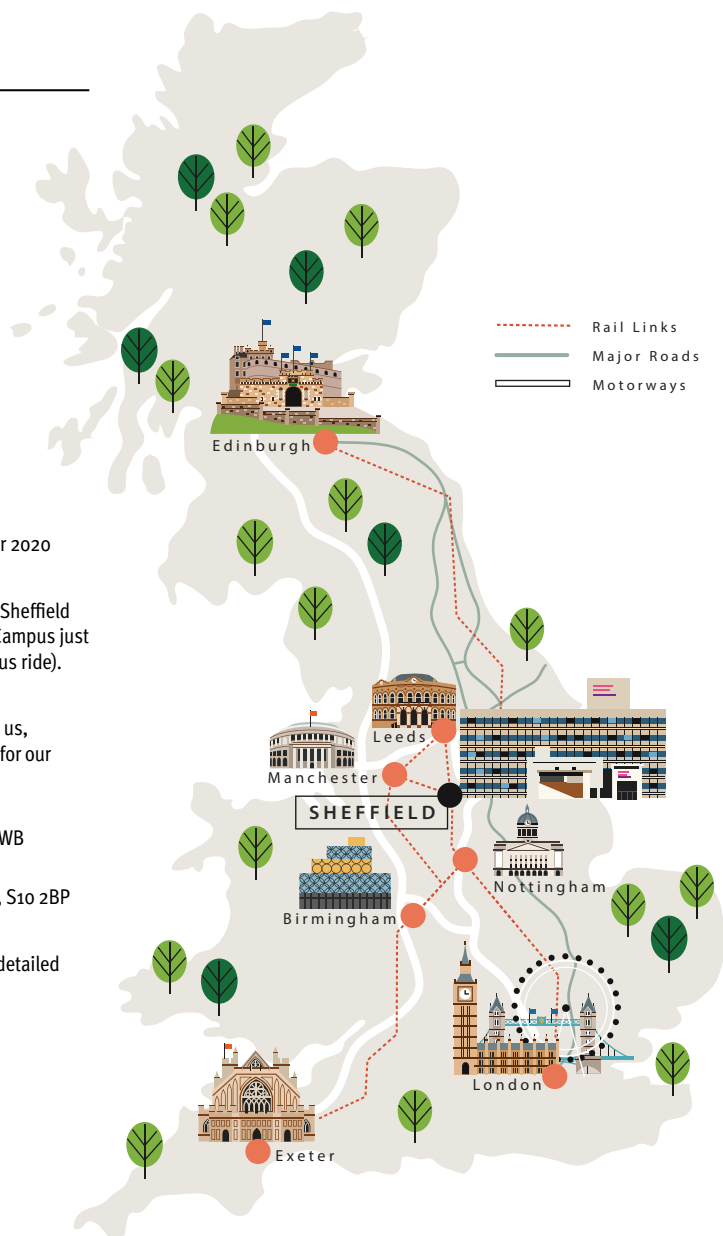

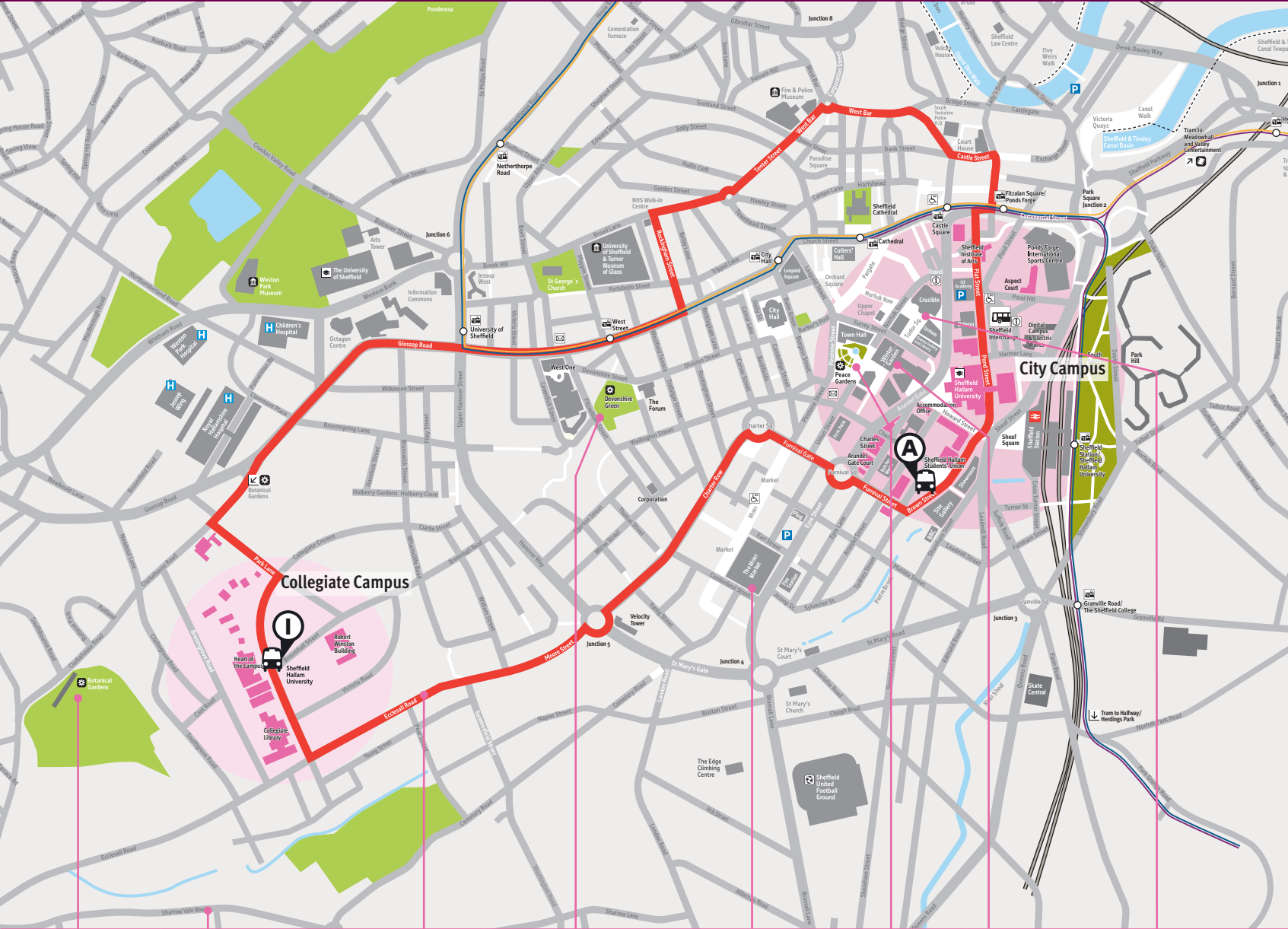
# CAMPUS AND CITY

We have two campuses, about 20 minutes' walk from each other. All day between 9am-3.30pm we are running a free shuttle bus between the two.

Approximately, the first bus from City leaves at 9am and from Collegiate it's 9:20am. The last bus from City to Collegiate is 4:05pm and the last bus from Collegiate to City is 4:30pm.

If you're at City Campus, get the bus from Brown Street (stop A). If you're at Collegiate Campus, get the bus from Collegiate Crescent (stop I).

Just ask a member of staff or ambassador if you need pointing in the right direction.

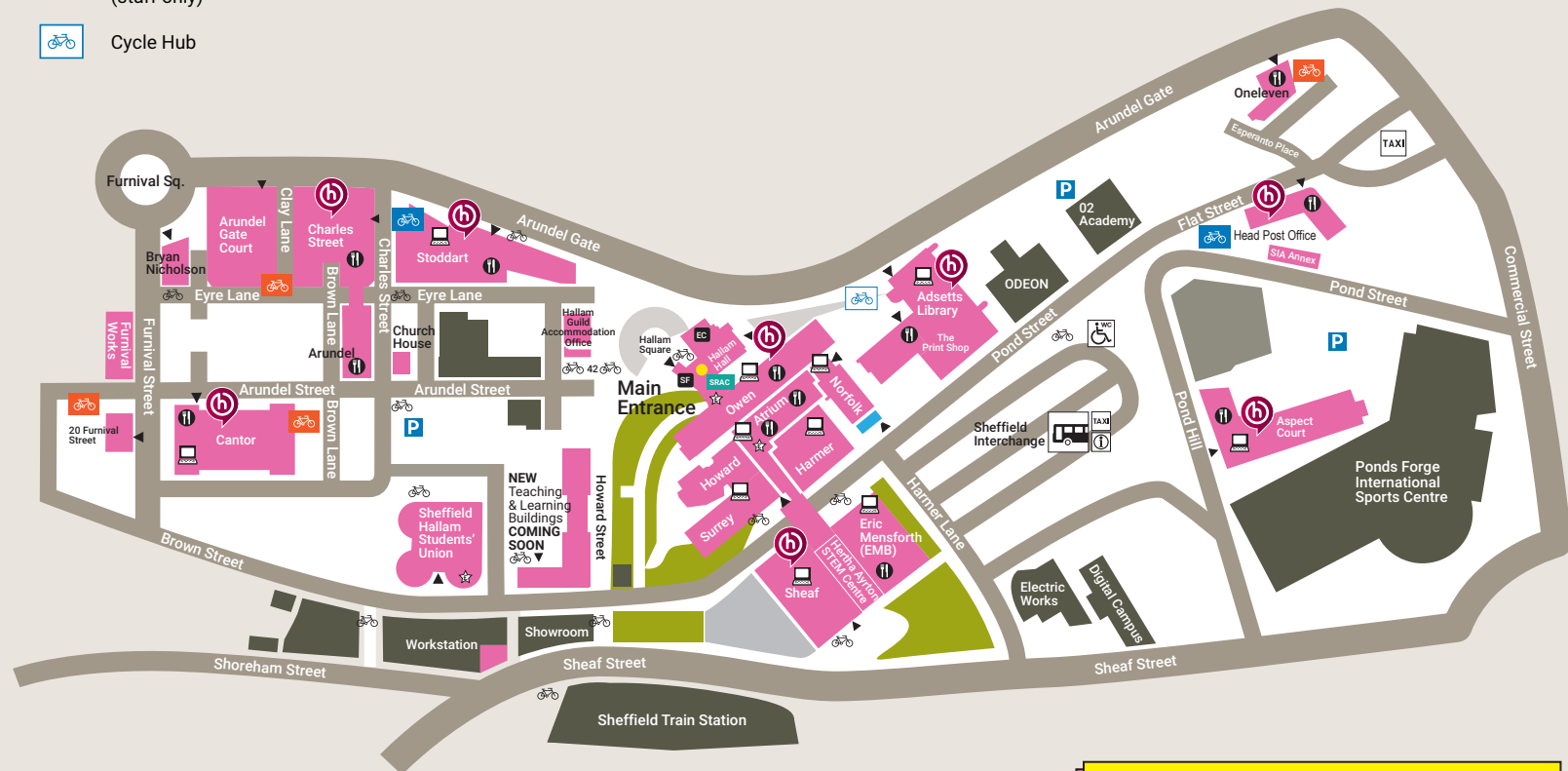

# EXPLORE THE

Make sure you take time out of your day to explore the city. Take our tour or strike out on your own. Here are some of our choices of places to visit within a few minutes' walk of City Campus. (For Collegiate Campus, turn the page.)

You can use our map on page 12 to find your way around the city.

## **Millennium Gallery S1 2PP – 1 minute from City Campus**

Located just opposite our main entrance, the Millennium Gallery is the most visited free attraction in the north. Be sure to check out the downstairs cafe Ambulo, which is part-owned by Arctic Monkey Matt Helders.

## **The Winter Garden S1 2LH – 5 minutes from City Campus**

A sanctuary of calm in the middle of the city centre, this enormous greenhouse has over 2,500 plants from around the world – plus shops selling coffee and work by local artists.

## **Tamper Coffee S1 2NU – 5 minutes from City Campus**

One of many, many local cafes near City Campus, Tamper is the perfect place to relax with a fancy coffee and a piece of cake. Treat yourself!

## **Division Street – 10 minutes from City Campus**

Along with all the usual high street names, Sheffield's full of quirky independent shops and cafes. Take a walk along Division Street and take in local favourites like MoonKo, Beartree Records and Mr Miyagi's Revolving Sushi Bar.



## **Take a city tour**

Want to know what it's really like living in Sheffield? Take a walking tour of the city centre led by our students. The tour lasts 45 minutes and starts at 11.30am, 1pm and 2pm from the tours stand on Level 5 of the Owen Building.

### **Ecclesall Road – 2 minutes from Collegiate Campus**

This popular student area mixes chains with vintage shops and local one-offs. Eating options range from Chinese to Polish and most things in-between.

### **Botanical Gardens S10 2LN – 10 minutes from Collegiate Campus**

Students flock here in the summer to study outdoors. Wander through the palm house at the top or circle the grounds to find more secluded spots and hunt for the famous bear statue.

### **Cocoa Wonderland S11 8PX – 10 minutes from Collegiate Campus**

This is a chocolate lover's paradise, run by a couple of Sheffield Hallam graduates. Treat yourself to afternoon tea or some proper hot chocolate.















# HELP WITH MONEY

**No matter your circumstances, anybody can afford to go to university. There is support available to help you afford tuition fees and living costs such as rent, food and socialising. You can apply for funding from the government the February before your course starts. Here are just some of the ways you can access financial support.**

#### Scholarships

We invest over £5m a year on financial support for our students. You can access funds based on your income, your grades, or your personal circumstances.

#### Student loans

You can apply to Student Finance England for a loan to cover your tuition fees and a maintenance loan to cover living costs such as accommodation, food, travel and course materials.

#### Part-time work
