Uni4U Programme


Inspiring activities, events and workshops for years 9–13

Uni4U activities are all about what's best for your students. All sessions are delivered under one of our core themes.

We can deliver them in your school or college or on one of our two university campuses. The sessions range from 30 minutes to a full day.

We want to highlight why your students may be interested in studying a particular course area and the careers it can lead to — not just the careers you would expect, but exploring how transferable skills from our courses can cross over into different areas. We can work with your students to change their perceptions and make them realise how a degree can prepare them for many jobs in different industries and sectors.

Pre-16 engagement

We also offer a variety of sessions specifically designed for this age group, exploring the benefits of higher education and dispelling any myths. We have developed interactive and engaging higher education roadshows for Y8, Y9 and Y10 students, plus support at careers events, option evenings and parents' events. All activities can be delivered in your school or college, around lesson times, or at Sheffield Hallam.

Student and parent ambassadors

Student Ambassadors assist and support across our work with schools and colleges, and as such are an invaluable part of the work we do. They are trained to lead on a variety of activities, including student life talks and campus tours. These students are excellent examples of the success stories of our student cohort, and their involvement is aimed at inspiring young learners.



Subject specific activity

Taster subject activities for years 9-13

We offer a vast programme of subject-specific activities including masterclasses and taster days. In each of our four faculties we have a senior schools and colleges engagement officer who can work with you and your academic colleagues on providing subject-specific support and activities

Some sessions have specific dates, while others are available throughout the year on request and can be included in your personalised Uni4U visit programme.

Masterclasses

These one-to-two-hour academic led sessions are designed to give students a flavour of a specific subject area through practical, interactive sessions. We have a set programme of masterclasses throughout the year, and bespoke sessions may also be available to suit a particular subject area or curriculum need.

Taster days

Our taster days provide students with an opportunity to discover the breadth of a particular subject area and career pathways. Through interactive sessions students will explore the subject areas and have a chance to find out more about university life.

Course talks

Delivered either at the university or in your school or college, these talks provide an insight into specific courses at Sheffield Hallam including entry requirements, course content and employability.

These may include


- tours of our industry standard facilities and modern learning spaces

Support for your students



Disabled student support team

We can

- offer advice and guidance to pre-entry university applicants and current students about the support available
- provide information and support for students with specific disabilities
- provide specialist induction events at the beginning of each academic year
- offer support with applications for Disabled Students' Allowances and carry out needs assessments at the Sheffield Regional Assessment Centre
- offer individual packages of support for each student according to their disability
- assist in the organisation of specific exam, teaching and learning requirements
- provide information and training on IT and Assistive technology for disabled students


Looked after children (LAC) and care leavers

We recognise the additional barriers faced by young people in care when progressing to university, and we are committed to supporting these students to maximise their potential.

Our support includes

- specific outreach activities to raise aspirations among looked after children and young carers (years 10–12) along with an annual CPD event for looked after children professionals.
- a dedicated contact for support and advice during the application process
- entry onto the Compact scheme
- access to careers guidance
- support with arranging 365 day accommodation
- the opportunity to attend exclusive visits at the university
- the opportunity to apply for the Care Leaver Bursary and UNITE Bursary

The Compact Scheme

The Compact Scheme gives extra support to students that face barriers in going to university due to their circumstances. It provides support during the application process and beyond.

Students are eligible if they

- are a care leaver
- · are estranged or have no contact with their parents
- are a carer for a family member or close friend
- have a disability
- have experienced circumstances which have affected or interrupted their studies
- are experiencing financial difficulty or hardship
- can't move away from their home area to go to university
- are a mature student
- are homeless or at risk of homelessness

When your students apply to Sheffield Hallam you can submit additional information about their personal circumstances which will enable them to access additional support.

Extra support includes

- a personal contact to help during the application process and answer any queries you have
- regular emails about Sheffield Hallam student life
- exclusive visits to the University
- the possibility of special consideration during the admissions process
- access to a workshop to help you prepare for an interview (applicants for health and social care, nursing, social work or QTS education courses)


Children's University

University open days

The Higher Education Progression Partnership for the Sheffield city region

The HEPP is a partnership between Sheffield Hallam University, the University of Sheffield, colleges, schools, local authorities and employers within the Sheffield city region.

Following in the footsteps of other regional initiatives such as Aimhigher and Higher Futures, the purpose of the HEPP is to raise aspirations and encourage the progression into higher education of young people, adults and work-based learners, with a particular emphasis on widening participation from disadvantaged groups.

Partners in the HEPP are working together to offer a regional perspective on higher education, and a broadly based and impartial range of services for young people and adults, their teachers and advisers.

HEPP activities include promoting a general understanding of changes in student finance, the value of university and graduate employability, updating advisers on subject requirements for higher education, and offering information for learners and their parents on options choices. These activities may be offered in schools, at HEPP meetings and conferences, or linked to other events in the region.
