BA (Honours) Professional Practice in Management (Facilities Management)

► OVERVIEW

The Chartered Manager Degree Apprenticeship (Facilities Management) is a trailblazer apprenticeship that has been developed by a group of employers, in liaison with the Chartered Management Institute (CMI) and higher education providers.

The apprenticeship provides an alternative to graduate recruitment and the opportunity to 'grow your own' talent. It includes a combination of work-based learning and business education, which leads to a BA (Honours) Professional Practice in Management and professional recognition through the award of Chartered Manager status (CMgr MCMI).

A range of contextualised modules are covered, providing progressive development for the students through each year of study, including

- Contemporary Business Environment
- Property Asset Management
- Managing Operations and the Supply Chain
- Innovation and Performance in FM
- Leadership in Contemporary Organisations
- Strategic Property Management

The Chartered Manager Degree Apprenticeship programme is suitable both for new recruits (eg school leavers entering into management positions) and for developing aspiring or existing managers already in employment who do not have a relevant management degree. The course fosters the skills, creativity and loyalty employers need for employees to commit themselves to an organisation and drive it to the next level.

Entry requirements	<p>For school leavers as direct entrants into the business</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• 112 UCAS points or equivalent with a minimum of 64 points from two A levels or equivalent <p>For post experience applicants</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• one A Level or equivalent and relevant work experience <p>In the absence of A levels, admission can be based on suitable work experience.</p> <p>International applicants should meet the academic criteria and all requirements of Tier 4 visa for entry to the UK.</p>
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Duration	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• The programme is usually delivered over three and a half years.
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Delivery method	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Typically learners attend university for three or four days at a time, approximately six times per year, although this decreases in the final year when the major in-company project is being undertaken.
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Assessment	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• The CMDA end-point assessment requires representation from the employer, the higher education provider and a third party independent assessor.• There will be a range of assessments throughout the course of study which will facilitate blended learning.
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Award info	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Successful participants will gain the BA (Honours) Professional Practice in Management (Facilities Management).
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Fees	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Employers who pay the apprenticeship levy can use their payments to cover course fees and assessment.• If your organisation doesn't pay the levy, you can still access government funding to cover at least 90% of course fees.• Fee amounts vary depending on your exact requirements.
